

## Books

The required books for this course are available at Amherst Books (8 Main St, at the corner of Main St. and Pleasant St.). For those of you who have not previously purchased textbooks at Amherst Books, they are located downstairs and are categorized by college and subject. You'll be looking for UMASS philosophy. From the bottom of the stairs, this section is in front of you and to your left. You should find five books:

You don't have to buy these at Amherst Books, but if you buy them elsewhere be sure that the edition is correct. There are alternate translations of *Being and Time* and the Nietzsche. I would prefer that we read the same translation. If you find the same translation, the edition might differ. This is the case with *Being and Nothingness*. There is an older 1956 edition of the same translation. (There is also a 2007 electronic Kindle edition.) The problem with using different editions is that the pagination differs. This makes it difficult to locate passages cited in class and to determine where assigned readings start and end. For these reasons, I would prefer that you buy the translations and the editions listed above.
