4. What are the traditional perfections? Explain why we define omniscience as we do, rather than just by saying "all-knowing". What other properties is God traditionally thought to have? State Principle G.
5. IEE* three versions of the Sandbox Cosmological Argument. Draw and explain appropriate diagrams to illustrate the arguments. Be sure to explain the meanings of any symbols used in the diagrams.
6. IEE* Leibniz's Argument from Sufficient Reason. Draw and explain an appropriate diagram to illustrate the argument. Be sure to explain the meanings of any symbols used in the diagram.
7. IEE* Paley's Argument from Design. As part of your evaluation of this argument, you must discuss an objection based on an alleged ambiguity in the concept of a purpose.
