1. Define 'ontological scheme.' List the seven kinds of entities in A Primitive Ontological Scheme; give examples of each kind on the scheme; state the fundamental questions of philosophical anthropology.
2. Present A Typical Form of Materialism (TM). How does TM answer the fundamental questions of philosophical anthropology?
3. EE the Argument from Consciousness against TM. Explain how a materialist would evaluate the argument.
4. EE the Argument from Psychic Phenomena against TM. Explain how a materialist would evaluate the argument. Be sure to discuss the alleged fallacy of equivocation.
5. EE the first Platonic Arguments from Death against TM. Explain how a materialist would evaluate the argument.
6. Present and comment upon each part of Cartesian Dualism (CD). How does CD answer the fundamental questions of philosophical anthropology.
7. Discuss the claim that one advantage of CD is that it provides the basis for an explanation of the meaning of 'alive'. Be sure to discuss three possible Cartesian accounts of the meaning of 'alive'.
- 7a. Discuss the claim that one advantage of CD is that it provides the basis for an explanation of the meanings of mindful sentences. Discuss at least one mindful sentence as an example.
8. EE the argument against CD based on the problem of other minds. Discuss some possible Cartesian replies.
9. EE the argument against CD based on the problem of origin.
10. EE the argument against CD based on the problem of causal interaction.
11. Be prepared for an extracto.
