This assignment concerns questions about language raised during the Early Modern English period. 3 pages or 1000 words. Be as speculative and non-committal as you like.

Alexander Pope's An Essay on Criticism expresses a number of the philosophical issues: Is there a direct relation between language and thought? Is judgment of linguistic (and artistic) correctness learned or innate? Are there linguistic universals?
