Basis for Waiver Application: Equivalent Course

Students may apply for waiver of these courses if they have had an equivalent course in another college or university with the following critical elements:

- a. cognitive and language development
- b. personal, social and moral development
- c. behavioral and cognitive learning theories
- d. motivational theory
- e. learning abilities and exceptional children
- f. standardized tests and measurement
- g. adolescent development
- h. fostering mental health in the classroom

Documentation: must include transcript indicating that the equivalent courses has been successfully passed with a B or better and a copy of the course syllabus or other documentation indicating the relevancy of the course to the critical elements listed above.

Waiving a course meets the requirement of the course but does not render credit for the course. Students in the Master's program will need to substitute an elective for any of the course they have waived if waiving the course will bring them below the number of course credits required for the master's degree.

Submit two copies of application for waiver, documentation, and self-addressed, stamped envelope to your faculty advisor.
